2. We will limit the use of Duolingo scores to the duration of the bans related to standardised testing during Covid-19 and not beyond. Duolingo scores will be accepted for all UNSW Global programs until further notice. Duolingo scores will be accepted for UNSW degree programs until 31 August 2020.
3. Duolingo scores will only be accepted from students in those areas where Standardised Tests are not available currently, including China and Iran.
4. Students with valid IELTS, PTE, TOEFL and Cambridge scores, holding valid UNSW offers, should not use Duolingo scores to gain entry into other programs requiring higher scores.
5. If students who have been accepted on the basis of a Duolingo score appear to be incorrectly placed at a level in their pathway course, UNSW Global will reserve the right to adjust the recommended period of study accordingly.
